

Letter from our Executive Director



Dear Friends,

The past year was a busy one for Green Building United, and I am pleased to share some stories of the successes we achieved together with our members and volunteers in 2018. This report follows the format of our new Strategic Plan, which was completed at the end of 2018, and provides information about the work we do in education, advocacy, and with our strategic initiatives.

Coming off of a rebrand with a new name at the end of 2017, Green Building hit the ground running in 2018 with a very active calendar of educational events and advocacy activities covering our full geography—10 counties stretching from Delaware to the Lehigh Valley—as well as wide range of topics and content. Under our new brand, where three green building organizations now exist as one, we have a broader focus that ranges from improving base building codes to benchmarking existing buildings and certifying them using the many tools and standards that continue to raise the bar for building performance. In short, Green Building United's goal is to improve the sustainability of all building types at all points in the building lifecycle.

As the building industry continues to evolve, Green Building United will lead the way locally on green building education, advocacy, and programs. We are fortunate to have the support of our incredibly active (and growing) membership in helping us to lead this work, as well as a long list of partners. We are eager to build on the successes of the past year, and remain focused on growing the impact we have in service of our mission.





COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHT

Demonstration Project

Throughout the year, Green Building United's Passive House and Living Building Challenge Communities have used charrettes and workshops to engage with the design community to rethink how to design and build using above code standards as a guide for future development. The Demonstration Project has explored the feasibility of renovating existing brick masonry rowhouses to the Passive House standard and designing infill affordable housing to meet the requirements of the Living Building Challenge. Both communities will provide two report-outs scheduled to be completed in 2019.



Education

Green Building United provides trainings and educational events ranging from cutting edge green building standards and practices, serving as a go-to source for GBCI and AIA continuing education credits. Our new Webinars on Demand library was launched in 2018, which now houses nearly 20 unique green building and sustainability focused videos.



Commercial Building Codes

In 2018, Philadelphia City Council unanimously voted to adopt modern building codes in Philadelphia, and the bill was promptly signed into law by Mayor Kenney. In a matter of months, Philadelphia transformed from lagging nearly a decade behind its peers to a nationwide leader in modern code adoption. The 2018 International Codes represent an increase in energy efficiency of **over 30 percent** as compared to current codes.



PHILADELPHIA 2030 DISTRICT



The Philadelphia 2030 District, a voluntary, private sector-led effort by the owners, managers, and developers of the city's largest properties to achieve deep reductions in energy use, water use, and transportation emissions. The initiative seeks to improve efficiency in the building sector in Philadelphia with the goal to lower costs, reduce carbon emissions, improve indoor air quality and tenant comfort, and improve the resiliency of the city's new and existing building stock.

The benchmarking program is a tool to measure and track building performance over time. It also allows building owners and operators to understand their building's performance relative to others in the marketplace.





ENERGY CODE IMPLEMENTATION

Green Building United, with our partners, offers trainings and networking opportunities to support recent, sweeping energy code changes in Philadelphia. City Council unanimously voted to adopt the 2018 International Codes, which represents an increase in energy efficiency of over 30 percent as compared to current code. This move is one important step towards the city meeting its goal to reduce carbon emissions 80 percent by 2050.




